Summary:

Arjan de Jager (7/8/1953) studied Physics & Mathematics and Information Technology in Utrecht, The Netherlands. After his study he worked as a lecturer Computer Science in the Netherlands and in Zimbabwe. From 1998 he worked as programme manager in the field of ICT4development amongst others for the International Institute for Communication and Development (IICD). IICD was established in 1996 with the objective to assist developing countries to keep up with the latest trends in Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs). At IICD he initiated and managed about 40 projects ranging from telemedicine projects to crop marketing bureaus.

In the last couple of years he got fascinated by the "new" Data sciences. He worked for Garage2020 (www.garage2020.nl/Amsterdam), an organization with the ambition to change the current youth care system in a drastic way by using ICT in the broadest context (inc. virtual reality, robotics, data analytics). Based on a data analysis in youth care he and his team developed applications such as a good, rapid risk analysis on escalation in youth care trajectories (such as foster care, youth detention, out-of-home placement) and support for the often difficult - decision making process by a group of youth care professionals. One of the resulting applications, the app Extra Teamlid (additional team member, see https://vimeo.com/371626846) has won a number of awards in the Netherlands such as the E-health award at the Dutch Design Week in Eindhoven (2018) and two categories in the Spin awards (2019).

Currently: Retired and working part-time as a board member ICT for 2 big organizations in the Care in the Netherlands and working on a few appealing projects as independent consultant. For instance: From June 2021 until January 2023 working as strategic advisor and analyst for the Ministry of Health in the Netherlands mainly focusing on quantitative and qualitative research on Corona outbreaks, vaccine efficiency etc..

My main responsibilities as a Country Manager were: The overall management of the programme including the management of the team at IICD (3 team members) and Uganda (12 full-timers), the monitoring and evaluation process, facilitating high-level workshops for decision makers, stakeholder analysis, support in programme formulation and implementation (mainly through coaching/advice and requirements analysis), monitoring of implementation (at various levels: impact, financial, process) and advice/coaching mainly at the level of organisational change and development.

IICD/ Team Leader Capacity Development, 1999 - 2005

Responsible for the overall Capacity Development programme at IICD (team of 4 Capacity Development Programme officers) and Manager Capacity Development Programme for the countries Uganda, Mali and Tanzania. The interventions of this programme were organised in co-operation with local training partners and Dutch companies (such as Cap Gemini, as part of their CRS programmes) to develop the skills (ICT related and non-ICT related such as strategic planning, project and financial management) needed for programme formulation and implementation.
